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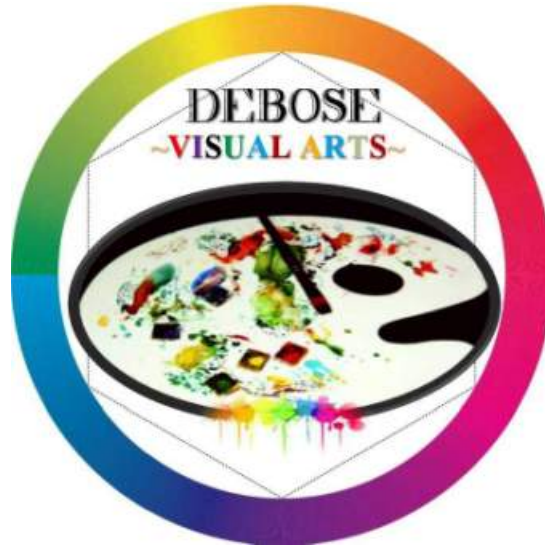
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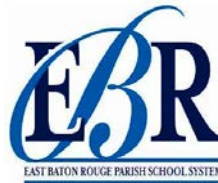

We look forward to your continued success and return participation.

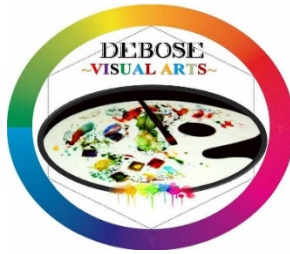

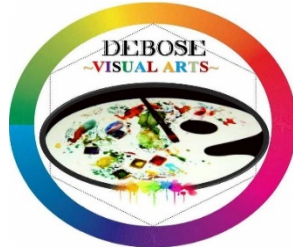

## 2 and 3 Dimensional Artworks

- **Must be matted with RIGID matte board to stand on shelf without folding. DO NOT USE ANY CONSTRUCTION PAPER.**
- **You may enter up to “10” 2-D art works, and up to “10” 3-D art works (per teacher). Reliefs meant to hang on the wall will be counted as 2-D.**
- **Please print or type each student entry form, and have the student sign it. Then tape the form securely to the back of the artwork. For 3-D artwork, attach to bottom or inside.**
- **\*In addition we will send you labels ahead of time to fill out and place on the bottom right corner of 2d artworks and put on or in 3d work (we will find a way to affix the label on display)**
